Klinik Crisis Line Volunteers

Volunteers play a vital role at Klinik. Many of the services we provide are only made possible through the commitment of time, energy, and caring provided by our volunteers.

Why Should I be a Klinik Volunteer?

- Assist people in need
- Contribute to your community
- Develop new skills
- Raise your social awareness
- Gain career-related skills
- Make a difference in the lives of others

Who volunteers at Klinik?

Klinik volunteers come from all walks of life. You don't need prior formal education or clinical experience. We provide extensive training and hands-on experience to enable you to work with people in crisis. If you are a caring, empathic person with excellent listening and communication skills, and the desire to support people in crisis, this may be a position for you!

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

What volunteer opportunities are available at Klinik in Brandon?

The Brandon office of Klinik operates 3 crisis lines: The Manitoba Farm & Rural Stress Line, the Manitoba Suicide Line, and the Klinik Crisis Line. Volunteers provide telephone counselling to people experiencing a range of issues including but not limited to: stress, domestic violence, sexual assault, addictions, mental health, relationships, sexuality, and suicide.

What kind of training will I receive to become a Klinik Crisis Line volunteer?

Volunteers receive over 80 hours of crisis intervention training over a 3-month period (2 evenings per week, 3.5 hours per session). People with farming backgrounds can also take an additional 8 hours of training to become volunteers on the Manitoba Farm & Rural Stress Line. Klinik training is hands-on and intensive, requiring a willingness to examine one's own attitudes and values and develop new skills.

What is my volunteer commitment once I have completed training?

A one-year commitment to the Crisis Lines is required upon completion of training. This consists of one 4-hour shift once a week: either 10-2 PM, 2-6 PM or 5-9 PM between Monday and Friday.

How do I apply to become a Klinik volunteer?

The application process begins with a short phone screening, followed by an in-person interview. Reference checks and Criminal Record and Child Abuse Registry Checks are also required before being accepted into the program.
